



Anne Basilica now has the resources needed to undergo a ~3-year restoration of the Basilica and the campus, in partnership with the Pulte Family Charitable Foundation's Catholic Initiative. We will preserve the historic beauty of Ste. Anne, while simultaneously ensuring its long-term sustainability. Beyond the restoration, this transformation will also strengthen the role of Ste. Anne as a center of faith, community, and service in Detroit. Through this partnership, we are committed to ensuring the Basilica remains a beacon of hope for generations to come.

By creating inviting gathering spaces such as a community pavilion and surrounding plaza, we aim to establish a welcoming hub for reflection and engagement.

A FOUNDATION FOR GROWTH AND RENEWAL

To ensure the long-term vitality of Ste. Anne, the Catholic Initiative will establish an endowment dedicated to sustaining the Church's mission and operations. Thoughtfully invested, this fund will provide financial stability, reducing the need for constant fundraising while allowing leadership to focus on serving the community. The endowment will accelerate critical maintenance projects, support new ministries, and expand programs that enrich parish life. By securing the Church's future today, we ensure its ability to serve and inspire for years to come.

A GROUNDBREAKING PARTNERSHIP

STE. ANNE & THE CATHOLIC INITIATIVE

The Catholic Initiative, founded by the Pulte Family Charitable Foundation, is an innovative, Vatican-approved model designed to restore and elevate churches, schools, and parishes, secure their long-term financial stability, and build stronger communities of faith. Under this model, Ste. Anne will transfer church property ownership to the Catholic Initiative, ensuring that the Ste. Anne community retains exclusive, permanent rights for 200 years through a 99-year renewable lease with an option for two 50-year renewable leases.

In addition to an investment from the Pulte Family Charitable Foundation, the Catholic Initiative will lead additional fundraising efforts to restore the basilica and its facilities while establishing a dedicated endowment for the Ste. Anne parish to ensure lasting sustainability. Ste. Anne will be the first partnership under this groundbreaking initiative, setting the standard for similar collaborations across the country. Parishioners of Ste. Anne can take pride in being part of a historic, first-of-its-kind effort to ensure the long-term vitality of their church and others in the future.
